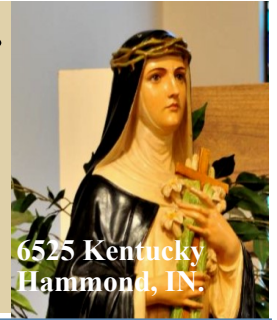

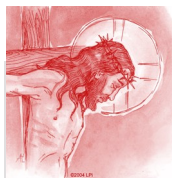

WHAT ARE THEY ASKING ABOUT THE CHURCH TODAY . . . In this Column I will answer questions about the ChurchLove your Neighbor as Yourself.h or the parish, so whatever you want to know about the Church or the parish, please just ask. In addition, we will sometimes look at Issues that affect our church or our members. This week I offer some thoughts on Tithing.

TITHING: HOW MUCH MONEY SHOULD I BE GIVING TO THE CHURCH, TO THE POOR?

How Much Should I be Giving

We have seen through Scripture that tithing is a long held practice in the eyes of God. In order to look at the question of how much should I be giving we must look at another aspect of tithing it is what I shall call the three pillars of Scripture. The three pillars of Scripture are pillar one "the Greatest Commandment," pillar two, "The last Judgment" and the third pillar "The Danger of Riches" Today let us look at the first pillar "**the Great Commandment**".

One of the scribes came up, and when he heard them arguing he realized skillfully Jesus answered them. He decided to ask Him, which is the first of all the commandments? Jesus replied: "Hear O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! Therefore you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. This is the second. You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these.

--Mark 12: 28-3 1--

Look at the first part of the commandment "Love god with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength." That is a tall order. How can we love in so complete of a manner? This, my friend will take much prayer perhaps you may never achieve this level of love but you must try this is all God is asking of us to try. It might be easier if you look at how you love your family and friends. Do you love God in this same way? You want to please your family and your friends you should also want to please God. So ask yourself this question do I worship Him as He deserves? Do I participate in my church activities and attend regularly? Do I give God the reverence due to Him in church, at Christmas and Easter, and in my daily life? Do I try to learn as much as I can about Him and what He is asking of me by reading, studying and living the Bible, the blueprint of life? God created heaven, earth, and us. How awesome is that!! Now ask yourself the question, do I love Him in return? Maybe you fall short perhaps we all do maybe it is impossible to love God at that level, however, we will please Him if we always try our very best. Next week. Love your Neighbor as Yourself.

Cuánto debo dar

Hemos visto a través de la Escritura que el diezmo es una práctica larga ante los ojos de Dios. Para mirar la cuestión de cuánto debo dar debemos mirar otro aspecto del diezmo es lo que llamaré los tres pilares de la Escritura. Los tres pilares de la Escritura son el pilar uno "el mandamiento más grande" pilar dos "El último juicio" y el tercer pilar "El peligro de las riquezas" Hoy veamos el primer pilar "**el Gran Mandamiento**".

Uno de los escribas se acercó, y cuando los oyó discutir se dio cuenta hábilmente de que Jesús les respondió. Decidió preguntarle, ¿cuál es el primero de todos los mandamientos? Jesús respondió: "¡Escucha O Israel! ¡El Señor nuestro Dios es sólo el Señor! Por lo tanto, amarás al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con toda tu mente y con toda tu fuerza. Este es el segundo. Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. No hay otro mandamiento mayor que ese.

Marcos 12: 28-3 1

Mira la primera parte del mandamiento "Ama a Dios con todo tu corazón, alma, mente y fuerza." Es una orden muy alta. ¿Cómo podemos amar de una manera tan completa? Esto, mi amigo tomará mucha oración tal vez usted nunca logre este nivel de amor, pero usted debe intentar, esto es todo lo que Dios está pidiendo de nosotros, intentar. Podría ser más fácil si miraras cómo amas a tu familia y amigos. ¿Amas a Dios de esta misma manera? Usted quiere complacer a su familia y sus amigos, también debemos querer complacer a Dios. Así que hágase esta pregunta ¿puedo adorarlo como se merece? ¿Participo en mis actividades en la iglesia y asisto regularmente? ¿Le doy a Dios la reverencia debida en la iglesia, en Navidad y Pascua, y en mi vida diaria? ¿Trato de aprender todo lo que puedo sobre El y lo que me está pidiendo por medio de leer, estudiar y vivir la Biblia, el plano de la vida? Dios creó el cielo, la tierra y nosotros. ¡Qué increíble es eso! Ahora hazte la pregunta, ¿lo amo a cambio? Tal vez te quedes corto, tal vez todos quedemos cortos, tal vez sea imposible amar a Dios a ese nivel; sin embargo, lo complaceremos si siempre hacemos todo lo posible.
