WHAT ARE THEY ASKING ABOUT THE CHURCH TODAY

WHAT ARE THEY ASKING ABOUT THE CHURCH TODAY . . . In this Column I will answer questions about the parish, so whatever you want to know about the Church or the parish, please just ask. In addition, we will sometimes look at Issues that affect our church or our members. This week I offer some thoughts on Tithing.

TITHING: HOW MUCH MONEY SHOULD I BE GIVING TO THE CHURCH, TO THE POOR?

How Much Should I be Giving

We have seen through Scripture that tithing is a long-held practice in the eyes of God. In order to look at the question of how much should I be giving; we must look at another aspect of tithing. It is what I shall call the three pillars of Scripture. The three pillars of Scripture are pillar one "the Greatest Commandment" pillar two "The last Judgment" and the third pillar "The Danger of Riches" Today let us look at the first pillar "**the Great Commandment**".

One of the scribes came up, and when he heard them arguing he realized how skillfully Jesus answered them. He decided to ask Him, which is the first of all the commandments? Jesus replied 'Hear O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! Therefore you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, with your entire mind, and with all your strength.' This is the second. 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these. Mark 12 28-31

Love your Neighbor as Yourself

You are acting rightly, however, if you fulfill the law of the Kingdom. Scripture has it; you shall love your neighbor as yourself. James 2:8

Your love must be sincere. Detest what is evil, cling to what is good. Love one another with the affection of brothers. Romans 12: 9-12

The whole law found its fulfillment in this one saying: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. Galatians 5: 14

There are numerous saints who have been tremendous examples of loving their neighbors, Mother Teresa being one that most of the world would recognize. Now we may not be Mother Teresa, but God is calling all of us to do something. If we just do our best and as much as we can, we will be pleasing to God.

Do not compare yourself to anyone else. Everyone has been given different talents, as well as different levels of expectations. Jesus tells us; "The more you are given [time, talent and treasure] the more is expected. Loving your neighbor could be as small as giving of your TIME to smile at someone or calling someone you have not talked to for a while or as big as going to work for a missionary group. It could be as small as using your TALENT for cutting the grass for a neighbor, or as big as doing medical work in a third world country. Loving others could be as small as using your TREASURE to donate spare change to a local soup kitchen, or as big as establishing a foundation to feed, clothe, and shelter the poor. Love never wrongs the neighbor; hence love is the fulfillment of the law. Romans 13: 10

DIEZMO: ¿CUANTO DINERO DEBO DAR A LA IGLESIA, A LOS POBRES?

Cuánto debo dar

Hemos visto a través de la Escritura que el diezmo es una práctica de larga data a los ojos de Dios. Con el fin de mirar la cuestión de cuánto debo dar; debemos mirar otro aspecto del diezmo. Es lo que llamaré los tres pilares de la Escritura. Los tres pilares de la Escritura son el primero "el mandamiento más grande" el segundo "El último juicio" y el tercero "El peligro de las riquezas" Hoy veamos el primer pilar "**el Gran Mandamiento**".

Uno de los escribas se acercó, y cuando los oyó discutir se dio cuenta de lo hábil que Jesús les respondió. Decidió preguntarle, ¿cuál es el primero de todos los mandamientos? Jesús respondió: '¡Escucha o Israel! ¡El Señor nuestro Dios es sólo el Señor! Por lo tanto, amarás al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con toda tu mente y con toda tu fuerza.' Este es el segundo. "Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo." No hay otro mandamiento mayor que estos. Marcos 12 28-31

Ama a tu prójimo como a ti mismo

Sin embargo, estás actuando con razón si cumples la ley del Reino. La Escritura lo tiene; amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. Santiago 2:8

Tu amor debe ser sincero. Detente lo que es malo, aferrándose a lo que es bueno. Amaos los unos a los otros con el afecto de los hermanos. Romanos 12:9-12

Toda la ley encontró su cumplimiento en este dicho: Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo. Gálatas 5: 14

Hay numerosos santos que han sido tremendos ejemplos de amar a sus vecinos, siendo la Madre Teresa una que la mayoría del mundo reconocería. Ahora puede que no seamos la Madre Teresa, pero Dios nos está llamando a todos a hacer algo. Si hacemos lo mejor que podemos y lo que podemos, seremos agradables a Dios. No te compares con nadie más. A todo el mundo se le han dado diferentes talentos, así como diferentes Niveles de

Expectativas. Jesús nos dice; "Cuanto más se les da [tiempo, talento y tesoro] más se espera. Amar a tu prójimo podría ser tan pequeño como dar de tu TIEMPO para sonreír a alguien o llamar a alguien con quien no has hablado por un tiempo o tan grande como ir a trabajar para un grupo misionero. Podría ser tan pequeño como usar su TALENTO para cortar la hierba para un vecino, o tan grande como hacer trabajo médico en un país del tercer mundo. Amar a los demás podría ser tan pequeño como usar su TESORO para donar cambio de repuesto a un comedor local, o tan grande como establecer una fundación para alimentar, darle ropa y darles refugio a los pobres. El amor nunca le hace mal prójimo; por lo tanto, el amor es el cumplimiento de la ley. Romanos 13:10
